Washington Library Association Legislative Report - January 26, 2024

Update:

- First cut off is next Wednesday, January 31st.
- WLA priority bill SB 5824 passed 49-0 out of the State Senate. It now moves to the House State Government Committee. It should go to the House State Government and Tribal Relations Committee where Friend of Libraries Bill Ramos is the chair.
- WLA testified this week on HB 2331 and SB 6208, companion bills setting up a consistent process statewide for instructional and supplemental materials challenges in schools. Thank you to Justin McKanaugh and Gavin Downing for coming to testify in person and to Sarah Logan for testifying remotely. (Did I miss someone testifying remotely). We are working on amendments with the prime sponsors. HB 2331 is up for executive session in the House. I expect this to be the vehicle that moves.
