Programs relevant to all kinds of libraries are sought. Additionally:

- Pre/Post-Conference Workshops are either 3 or 4 hours in length, or all day.
- Standard conference sessions are either 45 or 75 minutes in length.

- "WLA After Dark" sessions are 45-minute evening programs that are more fun or provocative than our standard fare.
- Lightning Talks are 10-minute presentations that focus on a concept, project, or how-to.

In some cases, strong proposals covering similar topics may be asked to combine into one program to provide varying perspectives on the topic and to ensure that we have room on the schedule for diverse offerings. Program Coordinators may suggest alternative presentation opportunities, such as panel discussions, lightning talks, or poster sessions, to allow for as much engagement and collaboration as possible at the conference.

Proposals are due no later than **December 4.** Applicants will be notified of their proposal status by **January 10, 2025**.

Applications Open for Jason Reynolds Travel Grant

ALA is accepting applications for its 2025 Jason Reynolds/Simon & Schuster Travel Grant. The grant will cover expenses for five Black/African American librarians to attend the 2025 Annual Conference in Philadelphia. Applicants must work in youth or teen services in a public library or as a librarian or media specialist in a school library.

Grant recipients will receive up to \$3,000 (and no less than \$1,5000) for travel, housing, registration, and ticket to the Coretta Scott King Book Awards Breakfast, where recipients will be acknowledged. Applications are due Dec. 1 and winners will be announced in Feb. 2025. For more information and to apply, visit the grant website.

Laura Bush Foundation for America's Libraries

Per the grant guidelines of the Laura Bush Foundation, the grant is to be used to purchase school library books, e-books, and magazine requests as outlined in your grant application. Use of the funds for shelving or furniture of any kind, equipment (i.e.: computers, electronic readers, Kindles, etc.), staffing, software, videos, guides, tests or exams, classroom book sets, or similar items, is prohibited. Eligibility Requirements

- A certified librarian or other paid professional must be assigned as responsible for the collection, care, and use of the materials housed in the school library.
- Public school applicants must be **Title 1 eligible**.
- Private and parochial schools are also welcome to apply if at least **50% of their student population qualify for financial aid**.
- Your school must have a library or designated space on campus where books are accessible to all students to check out.

Applications are due by 11:59 p.m. CT on **Friday**, **Dec. 6**.

State Broadband Office opens application for \$1.2 billion in funding

The Washington State Broadband Office opened the application period today for \$1.2 billion in federal Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) funding intended to bridge the digital divide in Washington by bringing high-speed internet to everyone.An additional \$300 million is state matching funds will be available to local governments and federally recognized tribes.The BEAD program is open to:

- Units of local government, including but not limited to ports and public utility districts
- Federally recognized tribes
- Nonprofit organizations
- Nonprofit cooperative organizations
- Public private partnership
- Private companies
- Public or private utilities

In addition, **projects must serve areas identified and approved through the BEAD process**. Commerce recently posted updated <u>BEAD construction project</u> area maps that detail unserved and underserved locations across the state that are eligible for BEAD funding.View the <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u> document and access the <u>ZoomGrants portal</u> to apply. Information about BEAD funding and more is available on the <u>Commerce Internet For All website</u>. The first 60-day round of applications closes in January, and further application rounds may follow. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) will review applications in May and June 2025, and the Broadband Office is expected to announce Washington's BEAD projects following NTIA approval sometime next summer.

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Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities

Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities will offer more than \$7 million in grants to small and rural libraries to increase the accessibility of facilities, services, and programs to better serve people with disabilities.

To be eligible, a library must have a legal area population of 25,000 or less and be located at least five miles from an urbanized area, in keeping with the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) definitions of small and rural libraries.

ALA will award four rounds of grants to be distributed over the next four years ranging from \$10,000 to \$20,000.
